Dear Parents

It has been another busy week here at LEH and the sun has come out at last!

Behind the scenes, the teachers continue to be busy developing the curriculum and most recently we have been working on History, Geography, Music and English as a staff team and with our advisors. From next week, I will begin to share some of this work in a curriculum section of the newsletter.

We are looking forward to an IT Infrastructure update over half term which will help things to run more smoothly and quickly. Mrs Marsden and I have held our first meeting with the company designing our new website and shortly we will be asking for parents who are able to support us in a working party to make suggestions on what would be useful on the website from their perspective.

We have lots of special events coming up over the coming months such as trips e.g. Harlow Carr, class workshops e.g. planetarium and sushi making, a whole school drumming workshop, not to mention our Year 6 residential to East Barnby in April!

PE Kit Survey Results

Thank you to those parents who filled in the PE Kit Survey. We had **78** responses in total and the results were as follows:

Class 1 (20 replies): 100% of respondents preferred their children to come to school in their PE Kit on PE/ Club days.

Class 2 (17 replies): 100% of respondents preferred their children to come to school in their PE Kit on PE/ Club days.

Class 3 (25 responses): 96% of respondents preferred their children to come to school in their PE Kit on PE/ Club days.

Class 4: (16 responses): 88% of respondents preferred their children to come to school in their PE Kit on PE/ Club days.

On balance, it would therefore seem that our current system is still the most convenient option for the majority of parents in each class and will remain in place at present.

Year 6 SATS and Residential meeting – Tuesday 7th February 2023

We would like to invite parents of year 6 children to a meeting where we will talk through the assessment procedures for the end of KS2. We will explain the SATS process to you, discuss the writing assessment that also takes place as well as sharing some example materials for your information.

The meeting will begin at **5pm in class 4** and we anticipate it will last no more than 1 hr.

A snapshot of this week’s learning



In **Class 1** RE we have been continuing our work on the creation story. In this picture we are having a circle time to think of some things that we could do to help our planet and make God smile. Our ideas included: Taking care of animals, putting rubbish in the bin, being kind to people, not cutting down trees and playing nicely with our toys and putting them away.

This week **Class 2** used their aliens to create a large Guess Who game which they played with children from Class 4. Class 2 used a range of vocabulary, including expanded noun phrases, in their clues. It was lovely to see the older children showing so much interest in the younger children's work.



Class 3

This week in Class 3, we have been exploring the different symbols and signs which are important in the Sikh faith. We have learnt about the importance of the Khanda and how it features on the flag above every Gurdwara. We have also learnt about the word 'sewa' which means 'service' and how this is an important value in the Sikh religion. Next week we will be making our own symbol to represent what is important to us in our lives.



This week in PE, **Class 4** have been looking at how to balance. In pairs, we gave each other feedback about what we were doing well and how to improve our work.



The children led our classroom collective worship, continuing the theme of courage. They acted out the story of Joshua taking over after Moses passed away.
